This role is a great opportunity to work in a fast-paced environment and learn more about natural history and wildlife rehabilitation.

- Provide day to day care for nestling and fledgling songbirds (including hand feeding, cleaning, and handling), juvenile gulls, ducklings and goslings
- Keep detailed records and observations on the nestlings and fledglings in care
- Setup and cleanhabitats
- Create and maintainenrichment
- Diet preparation
- Assist with volunteer and staff training
- Conduct daily observations and communicate concerns to senior staff

Key Qualifications & Experience:

- Previous animal handling experience, an asset
- Excellent communication, organization, and time management skills
- Ability to prioritize and problem-solve
- Willingness to take initiative and work independently
- Open availability (evenings, weekends, and statutory holidays)

To be eligible for a Canada Summer Jobs opportunity, youth must meet the following criteria:

- Applicants must be between 15 and 30 years of age at the beginning of the employment period;
- Bea Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person to whom refugee protection applies, and;
- Have a valid Social Insurance Number and be legally entitled to work in Canada.
